Helmut Graupner, JD, is a Vice-President (Europe) of the International Lesbian and Gay Law Association and Vice President of the Austrian Society for Sex Research and President of the Austrian lesbian and gay rights organization 'Rechtskomitee LAMBDA.' He is an Austrian member of the European Group of Experts on Combating Sexual Orientation Discrimination working for the Commission of the European Union, and of the Scientific Committee of the Center for Research and Comparative Legal Studies on Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity. He is a member of the World Association for Sexology as well as the editorial board of the *Journal of Homosexuality*. He serves as an expert advisor to the Austrian Minister of Justice and to the Austrian Federal Parliament on issues of sexual offense and anti-discrimination legislation. He was a guest lecturer at the University of Innsbruck on "Sexuality and the Law." He was the recipient of the 2001 Gay and Lesbian Award of the Austrian Lesbian and Gay Movement.
